



Sad Facts about CalWORKs 2019

- California has the highest child poverty rate in the United States of America.
- California has \$3.9 billion Federal TANF available for Cal-WORKs in 2018-2019. Only \$1.9 billion will be allocated to CalWORKs. The remaining \$2 billion will be treated as "Cal-WORKs Contribution to the General Fund".
- Only 40% of CalWORKs families get aid for their family size.
- 60% of the families are getting aid for one or more less persons compliments of CalWORKs sanctions, penalties, time limits and other anti-child and punitive features of the CalWORKs program.

\$2 billion CalWORKs dollars redirected from the mouths of CalWORKs babies and children enduring deep poverty to non-CalWORKs programs
