Preliminary Impact of HR 1 – the Big Baad Bill – [P.L. 119-21](#) on Food Insecurity in California The CalFresh Food Stamp Program

CalFresh benefit Reduction of **\$827 million**

303,000 Able Bodied Adults and Children who would not be able to meet the new work requirements

74,000 non-citizens who will lose CalFresh benefits

18,000 persons will lose the Standard Utility Allowance

43,000 Californians will see their CalFresh benefits go down while inflation goes up

CalFresh benefit cost sharing for California can be an estimated **\$2 billion annually**

California would have an additional estimated **\$685 million administrative cost** inn that the current 50-50% sharing has been changed to 75% state and county and 25% federal sharing

May 23 —Last day for fiscal committees to hear and report to the Floor bills introduced in their house (J.R. 61(a)(5)). Last day for fiscal committees to meet prior to June 9 (J.R. 61(a)(6)).

May 26 —Memorial Day observed.

June 2-6 —Floor Session only. No committee may meet for any purpose except Rules Committee, bills referred pursuant to A.R. 77.2, and Conference Committees (J.R. 61(a)(7)).

June 6 —Last day for each house to pass bills introduced in that house (J.R. 61(a)(8)).

June 9 —Committee meetings may resume (J.R. 61(a)(9)).

June 15 —Budget bill must be passed by midnight (Art. IV, Sec. 12(c)(3)).

July 4 —Independence Day observed.
