CalWORKs Property Limits

\$15,000 liquid resources for households with member(s) over 60 and **\$10.000** for all other households.

\$25,000 for a motor vehicle TOTALLY EXEMPT if used for work, as a home, for fishing or was a gift.

How to Does Earned Income Impact the CalWORKs Case

- 1 Substract the Standard Deduction of \$500 from the gross income
- 2. Divide the remainder by one half;
- 3. Subtract that number from the MAP or EMAP of the family size;
- 4. The difference will be the CalWORKs monthly benefit amount.

Who Is Eligible for CalWORKS CHILD CARE?

Any parent who is getting CalWORKs and needs child care - for nonstop12 months.
