\$3,000 liquid resources for households with member over 60 and **\$2,000** for all other households

\$9,500 for a motor vehicle TOTALLY EXEMPT if used for work, as a home, for fishing or was a gift.

How to Count Earned Income

- 1. Subtract the Standard Deduction \$225 from the Gross Income:
- Divide the remainder by one half;
- **3.** Subtract that number from the MAP or EMAP of the family size;
- 4. The difference will be the CalWORKs benefit amount.

Who Is Eligible for CalWORKS CHILD?

- 1. Persons who are getting CalWORKs money <u>and</u> working or participating in any WtW activity and need child care for children 12 unless the child is disabled.
- 2. Persons who used to get CalWORKs money in the past 2 years if their gross income is below 70% of the State median income (SMI) and need child care.
- 3. Persons who used to get CalWORKs money longer than 2 years ago if their gross income is below the 70% of the SMI, and they need child care, and if child care money is available

- About 50% of unduplicate participants do not receive transportation while surviving on a fixed income that is below 50 of the federal poverty level.
